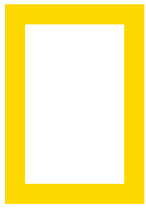

# AROUND THE WORLD THROUGH WINE WITH RAY ISLE



“Great wine is about more than just pleasant taste—it is inextricably linked to the history of a place. In short, it’s a remarkable way to travel the world in a glass,” says **Ray Isle**, Executive Wine Editor at *Food & Wine* magazine. Isle was instrumental in launching the unique collaboration between National

Geographic-Lindblad Expeditions and *Food & Wine*, curating the wine lists for voyages through the Pacific Northwest. With the success of those inaugural sailings, he recently helped expand the collaboration to the Mediterranean. Here, Isle explains why a destination’s culinary delights—and especially its wines—provide a fascinating lens for exploration.

“What can a glass of wine tell you about a destination? It can tell you about agriculture and cultural history. It can tell you what the climate was like the year the grapes were harvested. It can reflect the remarkable characters involved in the wine business.

“When I curated the wine list for the Pacific Northwest voyages, I tried to get across the notion that wine from a place is grounded in the geology and cultural history of that place—and I used the same approach in the Mediterranean.

“Many of the world’s great historic wines come from Mediterranean coastlines, and there are a lot of bases to cover. The region’s warm weather reflects in all the

wines—but as you travel from one stop to the next, the elements change. I tried to pick bottles that give a quick snapshot of each destination on your itinerary.

“Experiences bearing the *Food & Wine* name give people a deeper understanding of the culinary world, and National Geographic-Lindblad Expeditions is known for exploring what makes a place truly special. Excursions for these voyages were designed with an epicurean focus—for instance, having lunch in a Sicilian castle or going oystering in Dubrovnik and eating the oysters that you pull out of the water yourself. They invite you to learn something new about your destination, and they exemplify why this collaboration is the perfect pairing.”

# TASTING NOTES

Voyages with *Food & Wine* reveal the rich viticulture of your travel region, tracing the transformation of its wines from grape to glass. Here, wine experts **Amanda McCrossin** and **Anthony Giglio** tease the terroirs of the Pacific Northwest and the Mediterranean.



## THE NATURAL FORCES BEHIND PACIFIC NORTHWEST WINES

*Amanda McCrossin is a certified sommelier and a wine personality who has been called “one of the most influential creators” in the wine community. Join her on the April 8, 2025 departure of Columbia and Snake Rivers: Food, Wine and History (6-day).*

“Every grape has a thumbprint created by mother nature and the elements she controls, from soil to climate and the overall ecosystem. How these factors manifest in a wine’s taste profile is known as ‘terroir.’

“Floods during the last Ice Age flung massive amounts of sediment across the Pacific Northwest, leaving a variety of soil types in their wake. The resulting terroir is a patchwork, and wines produced within just a few miles of one another will often taste different.

“When it comes to Oregon wines, Pinot Noir is king. This fickle red does not tolerate much manipulation once it’s been harvested. For that reason, where Pinot Noir grows and how it’s treated in the vineyard is crucial to the final product.

“Most Washington grapes are grown east of the Cascades, where a rain-shadow effect keeps the region dry. Warm temperatures are hospitable to Bordeaux varieties—including Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot and Cabernet Franc—which dominate much of the area.



“As you sail here, you’ll not only taste incredible wines, but you’ll also have the rare opportunity to traverse the land, touch the soils and meet the winemakers. In short, you’ll get to see terroir in action.”





## WINES OF THE MEDITERRANEAN: ANCIENT ROOTS, MODERN EXPRESSIONS

*Anthony Giglio is an accomplished wine and spirits author and a longtime contributing editor at Food & Wine. He joins the July 23, 2025 departure of Crossroads of the Ancient World: Exploring Greece and Turkey.*

"Tasting wines in the Mediterranean gives you an opportunity to understand where all the grapes you know and love at home come from. Americans live in the "New World," but practically every grape hails from the "Old World"—Europe, in particular—so it's both interesting and fun to draw parallels with familiar wines while exploring their ancestors abroad.

"The Mediterranean has an array of indigenous grape varieties, such as Garnacha (Spain), Nebbiolo (Italy) and Xinomavro (Greece). Old World wines tend to be higher in acid, lower in alcohol, higher in earthiness, lower in tannin. In general, the Mediterranean paradigm is that wine and food belong together on the table, because each benefits from contact with the other.

"I firmly believe that wine tastes better when savored with others. I'm looking forward to exploring with like-minded passengers, all of whom (I hope!) are coming to experience the wine, food and culture of these ancient places together as a group."





# CHOOSING YOUR MEDITERRANEAN ADVENTURE

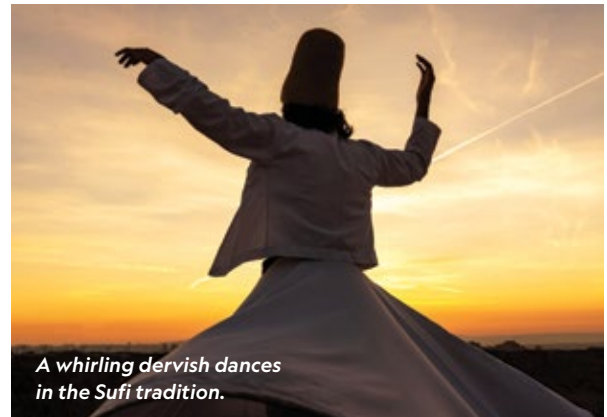

## Crossroads of the Ancient World: Exploring Greece and Turkey | 11 Days

Combine your exploration of the Greek Isles with a taste of Turkey, where Greek and Roman temples rub shoulders with Ottoman minarets and mosaics. Tap into age-old traditions, like dry-land farming, the Turkish coffee ceremony and the mesmerizing dancing of the whirling dervishes.

**Best for: ancient history, cultural discovery, water sports and excursions**

## Ancient Mediterranean: Exploring Greece, Croatia and Albania | 8 Days

The eastern Adriatic is bordered by a patchwork of colorful ports and hilltop forts rivaling any riviera in Europe. See a lesser-known side of Greece on the Peloponnesian Peninsula, en route to outlying Croatian isles and Albania's Divjakë-Karavasta National Park, home to more than 200 avian species.

**Best for: off-the-beaten-path exploration, birdlife, country collecting**

## Croatia's Dalmatian Coast and Montenegro | 8 Days

Nearly 10% of Croatia is preserved in parklands, beckoning adventurers of all sorts. Visit three national parks—including iconic Plitvice Lakes—and delve into traditions such as oystering and olive oil production in medieval cities like Dubrovnik and Kotor, Montenegro.

**Best for: active adventures, natural beauty, cultural discovery**

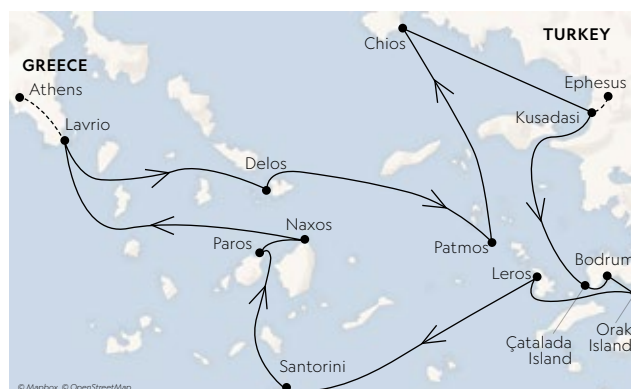

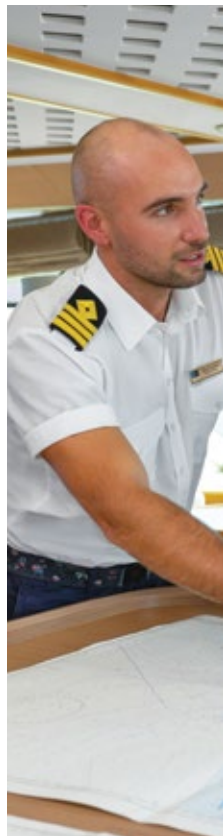

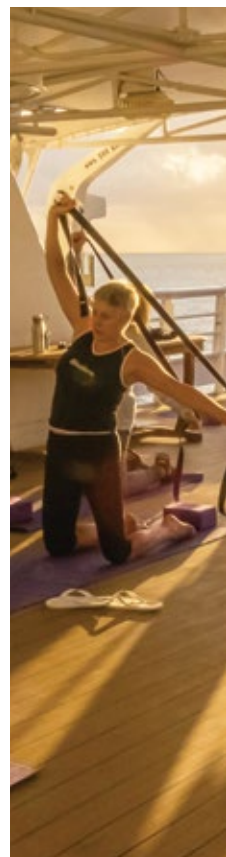
